**COURSE SYLLABUS**

**Course Title:** Drawing II

**Course #:** ART 112

**Course Description:** Continued exploration of drawing concepts, principles and processes presented in Drawing I. Contemporary concepts of space, abstraction and color media are introduced.

**Pre-requisite/Co-requisite:** Art 111

**Goals:** To develop intermediate drawing skills and concepts.

**Outcomes:**

- **To continue to explore the relationship of three dimensional form to the two dimensional drawing surface**
- **To apply descriptive, representational, expressive and conceptual properties of drawing to studio problems**
- **To continue to explore various media and methods of composition**
- **To apply spatial concepts and methods of abstraction to studio problems**
- **To critically analyze the form and content of a drawing and apply this vocabulary in discussions and in writing**
- **To investigate the themes in the works of historical and contemporary artists and deliver a comparative summary**
