COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Title: Painting II **Course #:** ART 152

Course Description: An intermediate course in painting. Topics include spatial relationships, composition, abstraction and self-expression. Digital painting may be explored. 3 semester hours (6 studio hours)

Pre-requisite/Co-requisite: None

Goals: To develop intermediate painting skills and apply compositional principles

Outcomes

1. To use the materials and processes of oil painting to increasingly challenging studio problems.
2. To begin to develop a personal approach to painting.
3. To gain exposure to intermediate topics in painting including contemporary use of space and collage.
4. To gain continued exposure to painters and paintings from the history of art.
