Course Title: Special Topics: Advanced Portfolio Project

Course#: ART 298 01

Course Description:

1.5 semester hours (6 studio hours)

Students undertake an advanced fine art project in painting, drawing, or mixed media and exhibit their work in The Gallery at Northwestern. Topics include contemporary processes, personal Content, media exploration, and working in a series. Previous art experience and permission of the instructor required.

Goals:

- To develop studio art skills through advanced studio work and exposure to contemporary issues in art
- To learn to exhibit art work in a gallery setting

Outcomes:

- To further develop studio art skills and principles
- To investigate the relationship of form to personal content through an exploration of materials, processes, and formats
- To research visual ideas and create a visual journal and sketchbook
- To develop an awareness of a variety of approaches to studio art
- To investigate selected issues in contemporary art
- To participate in a group show in the college gallery
