COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Title: American Sign Language III **Course #:** ASL* 201

Course Description: 3 credits This course covers in depth the structure of ASL grammar, fingerspelling/numbers, and visual-gestural communication. This course also involves expressive and receptive skills in storytelling and dialogue. Also information related to Deaf Culture.

Pre-requisite/Co-requisite: Pre-requisite- ASL* 102, DSC* 114 both with a grade of “C” or above.

Goals:

- Ways to recycle learned vocabulary
- Vary the range of expressions
- Use more complex language
- Use a normal pace
- Develop strategies using ASL

Outcomes: At the end of the semester, each student shall be able to use the following language functions and conversational behaviors appropriately in American Sign Language.

1. Transfer from personal information to impersonal.
2. Transfer from naming things that are present to talking about things not present.
3. Transfer from talking concrete things to abstract ideas.
4. Further develop cultural awareness and cross-cultural adjustment skills.
5. Communicate more confidently using ASL appropriately in real-life situations.
